Does AUF Conduct Residential Solicitation?

No. The AUF conducts the only campaign where people work. Two associate members, the American Heart Association in February and the American Cancer Society in April, will conduct a dual national fund-raising campaign aimed at areas not solicited by the United Fund on their behalf. Heart and Cancer Volunteer solicitors will acknowledge, with thanks, the gift previously made by these donors and leave educational materials at every home. Please post your AUF window sticker to show you have already given to Heart and Cancer and the other 42 causes.

Can I Designate Part of My Gift to My Favorite Agency?

Yes. A new form with space for naming three agencies is available in all solicitors' kits. Your favorite agency will have the amount you designate credited to its allocation. Please return all four copies of the form so the agency can make a proper acknowledgment directly to you.

Will There Be Other Campaigns?

Yes, but not where you work. Most employers permit only this one annual solicitation on company time.

Capital fund-raising campaigns and mail appeals are not eligible for participation in the Aloha United Fund. The United Fund is only concerned with eliminating face-to-face solicitation for operating funds in business, industry, government and labor. Mail campaigns are not invited because they are non-competitive in use of volunteer time.

How Are Funds Allocated to Agencies?

Following last year's campaign the AUF--through its eight Budget Review Panels and Central Committee (75 members in all)--spent over two months reviewing services and analyzing financial data in budgets submitted by the participating agencies. This was done to insure that the funds contributed by the public were being used to operate agencies in the most economical and efficient ways possible. Questions of whether agencies are meeting the high standards of admission to the United Fund or whether the services could be made more effective in helping people in need are referred for more extensive study to the Honolulu Council of Social Agencies.

Do Agencies Get All Their Money From the AUF?

No. Many agencies receive a share of their funds from other sources, such as membership fees, special events, sale of products, partial fees for services, and from persons closely affiliated with their work.

The Aloha United Fund provides the budget-balancing amount between what the agency raises and its total approved expenditures.

Are Funds Used to Build Buildings?

No. Funds are not used to build new facilities for any of the participating agencies. However, funds are budgeted by AUF to finance normal repair and maintenance needs of existing facilities.

Fire Prevention Week--1967

1967 marks the 45th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week, the oldest Presidentially proclaimed "week" in the United States.

Last year more than 12,000 persons died as a result of fire and property losses totalled more than \$1,496,000,000. In Honolulu, six persons died as a result of fire and \$4,209,270 worth of property was destroyed, the heaviest loss in many years.

Because much of Hawaii's last year's loss of life and property was in dwelling fires, 1967 Fire Prevention Week features home fire safety. Here is what you can do to help prevent fire in your home.

- 1. The combination, matches-smoking and misuse of electricity, account for 40 per cent of all fires of known origin; therefore, home fire prevention should start at these danger spots. The following precautions will reduce hazards: (1) Never smoke in bed! (2) Keep matches away from children. (3) Have plenty of ash trays. (4) Keep your house clear of rubbish. (5) Don't overload electrical outlets. (6) Don't run cords under rugs. (7) Check your home before going to bed, and (8) Have a fire escape plan - REHEARSE IT!
