Sign up for emergency alert notifications

Be prepared! Sign up to receive emergency text alerts at http://www.hawaii.edu/alert in the event of a UH West O'ahu campus emergency. If you have already signed up, log in to http://www.hawaii.edu/alert to ensure your contact information is current. There is an option to send a text message to your cell phone. UH West O'ahu will conduct a test of the UH Emergency Alert notification system on Monday, April 28 at 10 a.m. At this time, all faculty, staff, and students will receive an emergency test email and other notification procedures will take place. Those who have signed up to receive emergency text alerts will receive the test information via text on the mobile number provided.
