

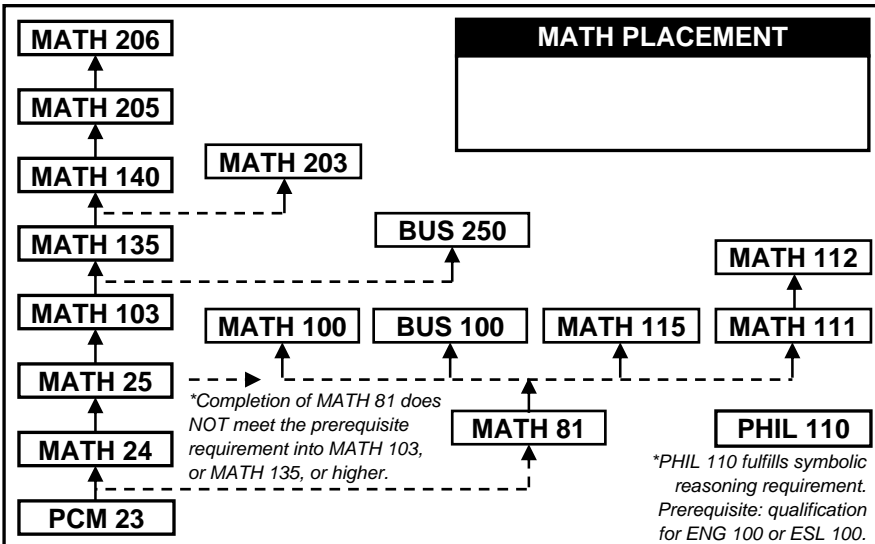
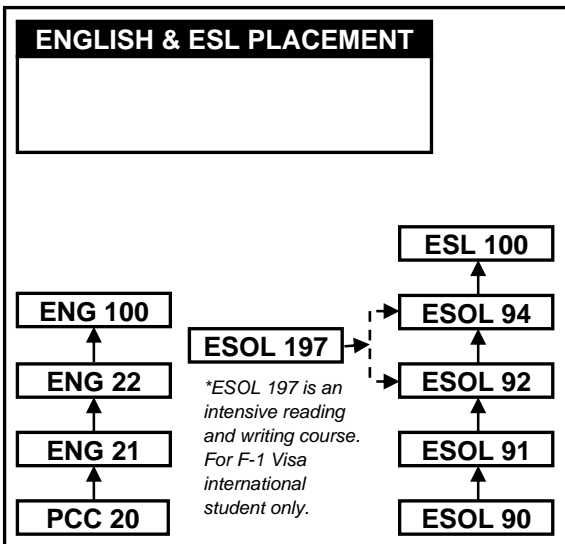
Advising & Planning Sheet - Associate in Arts, Liberal Arts 2008-09
