Archaeological Field Techniques class unearths history at Honouliuli Internment and POW Camp

UH West O'ahu's Archaeological Field Techniques summer class, taught by Instructors Dr. Mary Farrell and Dr. Jeff Burton, was recently featured on [KITV4](#) and [Hawai'i News Now](#) for the class' work at the Honouliuli Internment and POW Camp in Kunia. In addition to practicing hands-on excavation techniques, students in the Anthropology 181/381 class learn about a relatively unknown part of World War II history related to the incarceration of local residents and enemy nationals in Hawai'i. UH West O'ahu student Earl Ramsey commented, "You are actually working in a place where people actually interacted. This [is] where they lived. This [is] where they worked. This is where their lives were. Whereas in a book, you just have pages and pages. You get to experience what their life was like."
