

Annual Physicals for Man and Machinery Dr. Jay Speaks to Ewa Students

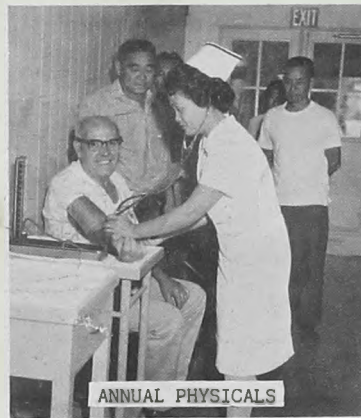
Our grinding season for this calendar year came to a close on Thursday, October 1st. This begins the off-season work which means repairs to the plantation's machinery and equipment.

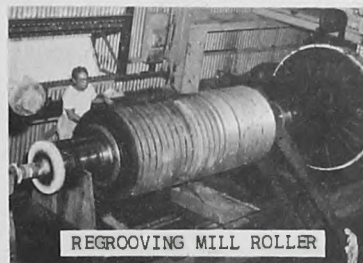

BACK IN POSITION

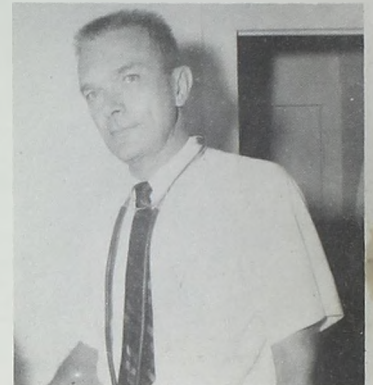

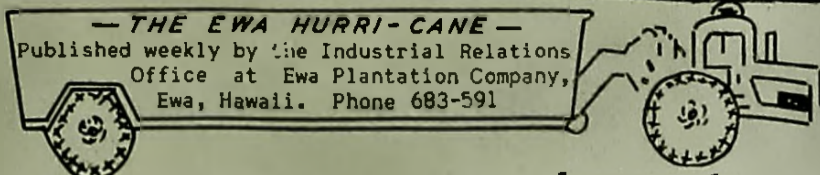

HOME FIRE SAFETY TIPS
