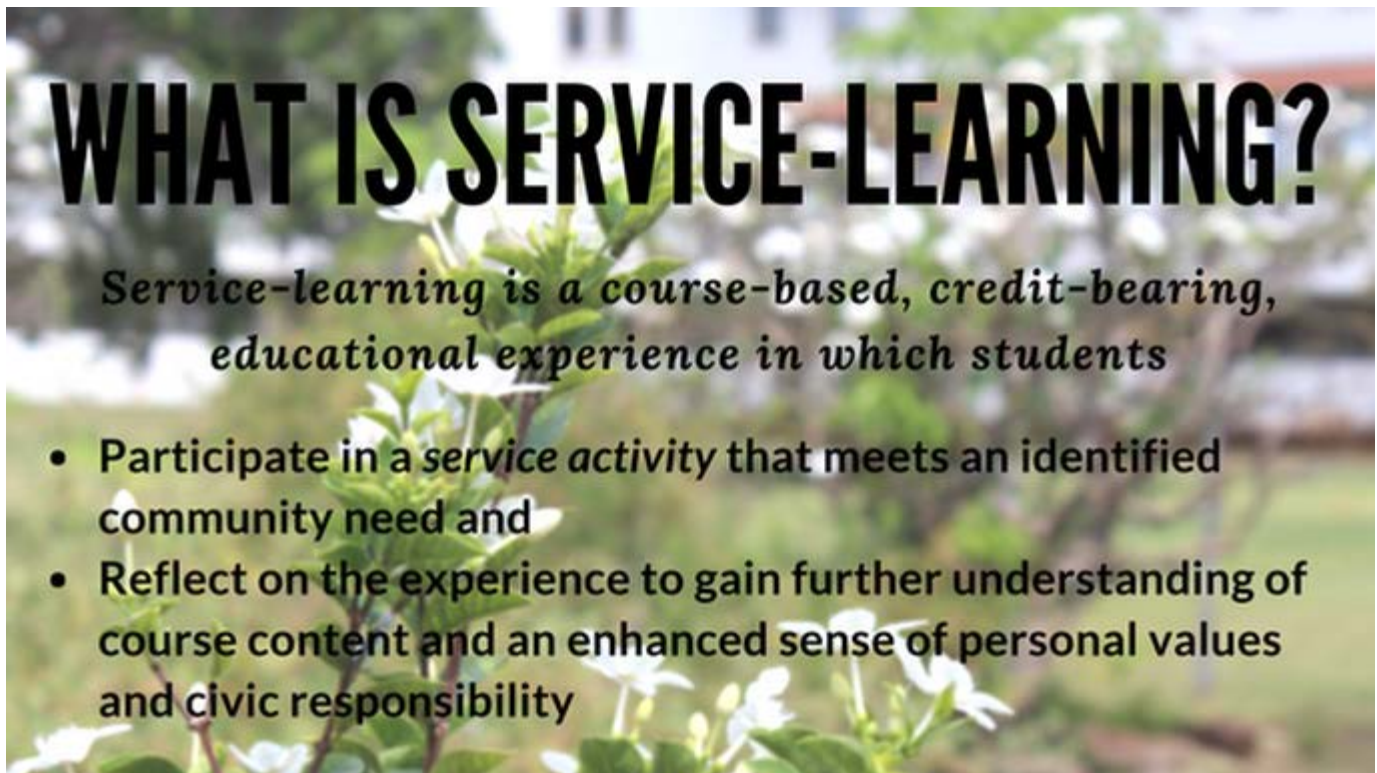

HOW TO BECOME A SERVICE-LEARNING STUDENT

1. Complete Orientation

You can do an online orientation OR participate in an in-person orientation.

Online (January 12 to February 12):

- Login to the [Service-Learning Laulima site](#) (use your UH username and password). If you are not already in the site, Laulima will ask if you want to join -- click yes.
- Click the Spring 2018 link on the left menu bar on the Laulima site and follow the instructions on the Complete orientation page (Complete information sheet, view slide deck, and take quiz).
