## The Plantation

Light to moderate showers marked the weather for the first half of the week with generally dry clear weather prevailing for the second part of the week. Accumulated rainfall ranged from 1.11" at the Field 43 gauge to 0.39" at Reservoir #10.

Wednesday, December 31, and Thursday, January 1, were observed as plantation holidays.

With most of the field workers still on vacation and only three working days during the week, there was little activity in the field department except for some irrigation.

Not much progress was made in the factory this short work week. Only three men were available on Monday and Tuesday and two more returned from vacation on Friday. Three men were assigned to the shop as helpers and two remained in the mill repairing Coulter juice strainers and Meinecke chutes.

The two electricians working this week continued with assembly of low grade centrifugal motors.

## Ewa Supervisors To HSPA Courses

Three Ewa supervisors this week began attending the HSPA's four-month-long courses in sugar cane agriculture and cane factory technology conducted by the staff of the HSPA Experiment Station. The three are Stephen Glipa, irrigation foreman, and Frank Goto, overhead irrigation foreman, both enrolled in the sugar cane agriculture courses; and Shohichi Tomoyasu, fireroom foreman, enrolled in the cane factory technology course.

Glipa, Goto and Tomoyasu are among 25 employees of HSPA member companies registered for the course this year.

The educational program, established by the Hawaiian sugar industry in 1925, has played an important role in developing management level personnel for the industry. More than 500 sugar men have participated in the program during its four and one-half decades. Presently, 65 percent of Hawaii sugar company managers and more than 75 percent of industry assistant managers and factory and field superintendents are graduates.

## Keep Your Records Up to Date

It is very important that your company records be kept up to date. If you haven't done so already, NOW is a good time to contact Industrial Relations if:

(1) You have changed your residence or mailing address. It is important that correspondence intended for you be sent to the right address. You should also notify your other correspondents of your new address.

(2) The number of your dependents has changed due to birth, death, adoption or marriage. New withholding tax exemption certificates for both the Federal and State governments must be filed.

(3) You have recently married. You might want to name your wife as your beneficiary in the company retirement plan.

(4) A dependent child becomes 19 years of age. If no longer attending school full time, he has to be dropped from the company medical plan.

(5) Your spouse begins working. If your spouse's employer offers medical plan coverage, your spouse must be dropped from the company medical plan.

## Alien Reports Due In January

The Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952 requires each alien who is in the United States on January 1, 1970 to report his current address to the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization during the month of January.

Aliens absent from the State must report to the Federal Immigration Service within 10 days after returning.

Willful or inexcusable failure to register may result in deportation, imprisonment, fine, or all three.

Address report cards are available at any post office and completed cards can be returned to any post office.

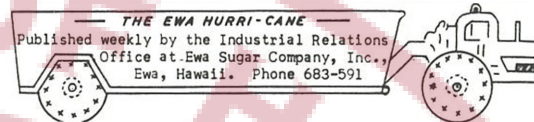

Minor accidents are quite often the cause of a major accident. If we get careless and do not pay attention to the non-lost time accidents, it is not long before we find ourselves involved in a serious lost time accident. Just remember that every accident is serious no matter how small. A non-lost time accident is a warning that something is wrong, someone is not practicing safety and has become careless. A lost time accident is a serious warning requiring immediate attention in order to determine why it was not prevented from happening.



In working at the same job every day we may become careless and probably do not give the necessary thought and care required for our safety and for those who work with us. It is the responsibility of every supervisor to his men and the responsibility of every worker to himself to see that only safe work methods and equipment are used on the job.
