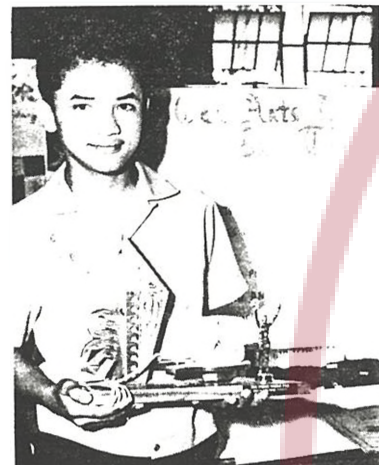

Ewa School's Fourth Annual Science Fair was held on Tuesday, February 19 at the school auditorium. In all, about 90 students turning out 69 projects competed in this fair.

Winifred Hata, an eighth grader, for her project, "Does a Certain Blood Type Dominate in a Certain Race?" was selected the overall grand prize winner from among the girls' entries and Victor Pantohan, Jr., also an eighth grader, was picked as the boys' overall grand prize winner for his project "Can Ants Distinguish Poison in Their Foods?". Both of these students were awarded clock trophy donated by the Ewa School PTA.

Winifred's project will be entered in the State Science Fair final which will be held at the Hilton Hawaiian Village Dome from March 15th through the 17th.

Sandra Fujita, sixth grader, was selected as the second overall winner for her project on "Cigarettes" and her older brother, Claude Fujita who is an eighth grader, was chosen third overall winner for his project on "Solar Cell".

Bryan Iwata, eighth grader, took fourth place with his project on "What is the Effect of Colored Light on Mold?". The two in the intermediate division who received honorable mention were Karen Yoshioka for her "Plant Reaction to Light" and Gordon Yamasaki for his "Soil Testing with Organic Matter".
