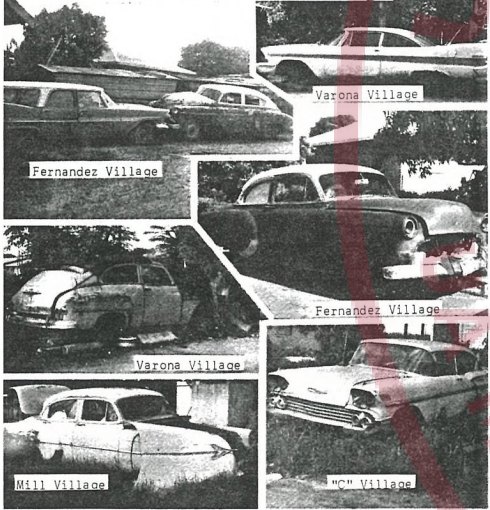

INCIDENTALLY - There is a bill, (H.S. No. 583), introduced by Representative T. C. Yim relating to the disposition of abandoned vehicles. It passed Second Reading in the House on March 2. Excerpts from this bill are as follows:

The counties of Hawaii, Kauai and Maui and the City and County of Honolulu may cause to be taken into custody, and to dispose of the same, vehicles which have been left unattended for a continuous period of more than twenty-four hours and which are unlawfully on any public highway or other public property, or which have been left on private property without authorization of the owner or occupant of such property.

A notice need not be sent to a legal and/or registered owner or any person with an unrecorded interest in such vehicle whose name or address cannot be determined.

If the vehicle is not repossessed within the time limits hereinabove provided, the vehicle shall be disposed of by public auction.

The Hawaiian Education Television Network is an educational broadcasting service of the University of Hawaii and the University of Education. On this island it is called KHET, Channel 11. This channel and those on other islands were created by Legislative action in 1965 as a result of the recommendations of the Governor's Advisory Committee on Educational Television.

Three types of programming are: (1) In school instruction, (2) In service teacher training, and (3) Adult programming.

Some of the coming programs for your enjoyment and education are: Spring Vacation, Ten Commandments of Management, Basal Ground Water and Its Development, Earthquakes and Effects, The Orchids, Science Fair and Coral Reef Relating to Pet Skunks, Sponges, Sharks, and many other subjects.

Vietnamese Look Us Over

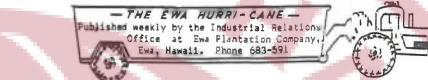

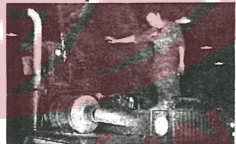
