Damaged by Heavy Rain



The flash-flood last week caused severe damage to some of our growing cane, storm ditches, and irrigation system. Our Field 5, one of the hardest hit, felt the impact of rushing waters from the upper lands and rolling rocks did further damage to sections below.

Crews are doing an excellent job in clearing and reshaping these areas according to Assistant Manager, Bob Cushnie. It is impossible at this time to estimate the cost of repairs because of the hidden damage not yet known in some of our more matured cane.

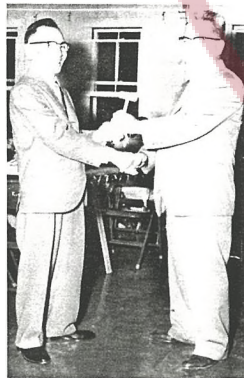
