**Widening of Mill Bridge Underway;
Traffic Rerouting Effective July 16th**

The widening of the bridge which passes over the first cane conveyor at the Cane Cleaning Plant is now underway.

The present width of the bridge which is 24 feet will be extended to 50 feet. At the same time the bridge will be raised an additional 15 inches. The increase in the height of the bridge is primarily to prevent pile-up of cane under the bridge.

Applications are still being accepted. Any woman residing in Ewa Plantation community may apply for the scholarships in writing to the Director of Industrial Relations. However, before you apply for the scholarship, you must have passed the various examinations given by the Queen's hospital for entrance to its nursing school.

Deadline for applications will be announced in a later issue of the Hurri-Cane.

The bridge of steel and concrete construction, being built by our shop personnel, is designed to handle all types of heavy vehicles.


Also, the road leading up to the bridge from the Barber's Point side will be raised about 2 feet at the lowest point. The leveling-off of the road will start from the corner of the plantation garage up to the bridge. This is to eliminate the accumulation of storm water at this low section.

Effective Monday, July 16th, the bridge will be closed to all traffic and will remain so for about 5 weeks. Barber's point personnel are encouraged to use Gate 3 which will be opened 24 hours a day while the bridge is under construction. Bus services, however, will continue to operate through Gate 2 and will be re-routed through the plantation village.

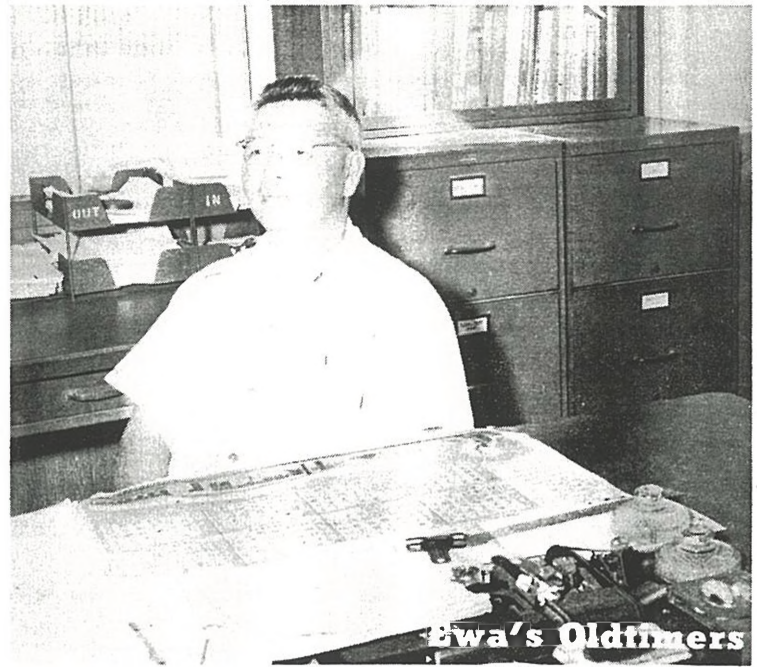

John is now back on his former job at Ewa.

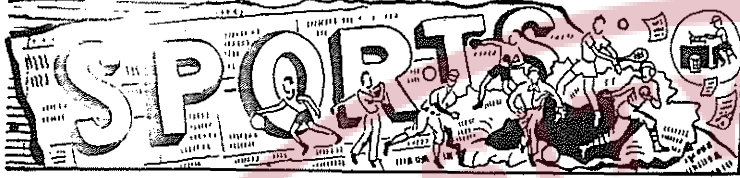
