These fellowships are available through federal funds from the U.S. Department of Education Title III Part A Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian-Serving Institutions Program (CFDA #84.031) collaborative award with UH Maui College.

## Two types of Title III Consortium Fellowships are available:

Revitalization Awards (long-term professional development): Revitalization Awards provide financial assistance for Kapi'olani Community College employees who are currently enrolled in degree-seeking programs for cost of attendance, including tuition, books, student fees, and other related costs. These fellowships support the University's mission of retaining high quality personnel as an essential ingredient of a good university.

Refresher Awards (short-term professional development): Refresher Awards encourage faculty and staff to participate in professional development opportunities to enhance knowledge of current trends in higher education, with a focus on modern technology, indigenous perspectives, and other topics that support Kapi'olani Community College's strategic planning goals. Refresher Awards cover participation costs for seminars, workshops, conferences, and other short-term activities that provide opportunities for publication, presentations, and service to the profession.
